

Mansell heads off to Holland for Euroboss Championships

Race ace Scott sets a top five target

SCOTT Mansell has set his sights on a top five finish when he competes in the latest round of the Euroboss Championships this weekend.

The 16-year-old from Clifton Campville won his class and finished seventh overall at the last round of the competition which was staged at Most in the Czech Republic.

This time Scott, who is in the formula 3000 class, is off to Zandvoort in the Netherlands and is confident of going better and possibly mixing it with the ex-Formula One cars.

"The car is in good shape," he said. "I also took a lot of confidence from the last round.

"A lot depends on the track. The quicker tracks are always going to favour the Formula One cars.

"I haven't driven in Holland before but I understand the track is more twisted and, therefore, it will give me

more of a chance, it will even things up a little bit."

"I have set myself a top five finish before the end of the series and hopefully, it might be in Holland."

Scott rose to prominence last October when he was the Autosport Driver of the day for his excellent second place at the Brands Hatch Winter Series.

The Bishop Vesey pupil became the Euroboss series' youngest ever racer in his 1991 F3000 Reynard Mugen, formerly driven by Christian Fittipaldi.

With the previous victories shared between them, former F3000 driver 29 year old Phil Andrews in an Ascari Judd V10 and 22-year-old Earl Goddard driving a 1994 ex-Schumacher V8 Benetton Ford are the favourites to take the honours this weekend.
